Torrance as well. McGinnis charged that in erecting barricades "a property right has been unlawfully and arbitrarily taken from my clients..."

"Arbitrary" He labeled PV's action "arbitrary" and "without good and sufficient cause."

"It is also my opinion that the barricading of the said streets, as a matter of principle, is contrary and directly opposed to the best interests of the public at large," McGinnis claimed.

For one thing, it creates dangers in cases of emergency, he maintained.


