**Torrance Sixth Among 73 Cities**

Torrance stands in sixth place among 73 Southland cities in building activity for the first half of 1955. Leading Torrance in building permits issues are Los Angeles, San Diego, Long Beach, Anaheim, and Fullerton, respectively.

While Torrance is in sixth place for the first six months of the year, it stands in fourth place as far as June is concerned, surpassing both Anaheim and Fullerton.
