Mirador Heights, located at 179th street and Crenshaw, is open this week officially to the public. Jim Culver, representative of the Mirador Realty firm, stated.



**Residents Complain About Ditch**

about the type of drainage pipe needed for the ditch.

Bishop said investigations made by the county would corroborate his figures. The Council asked that he obtain the county reports.

**Council Says Pull Out Trees Must Pay**

Subdividers will be charged for ripping out trees where they had no authorization to do so, according to action taken by the City Council Tuesday night.

The motion was initiated by Councilman Victor Benestead who complained about the many trees which are being pulled out, especially around Torrance boulevard and Hawthorne.

He asked that a bill should be sent to the Kauffman-Wilson Construction company for pulling out a number of trees in their tracts.

Councilmen Nick Drale and Mervin Schwab opposed the measure.

City Manager George Stevens pointed out that in many instances the city's demands for the widening of streets and the methods of modern planning require the removal of these trees.

Individuals who permitted these trees to be planted did not anticipate present conditions, Stevens explained.



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
