we're going to lose not only the municipal court but the superior court," Perry informed Redondo councilmen.

Upon Perry's recommendation, councilmen voted to adopt resolutions urging Governor Goodwin Knight and the city's legislative representatives in the state and county to maintain the municipal court and to open a branch of the higher court.

They also agreed to ask Hermosa, Manhattan, and Palos Verdes to aid them by adopting similar resolutions.

In the meantime, Torrance has bombarded state and county officials with resolutions and local clubs and organizations have been contacted to lend their report by passing individual resolutions which will be submitted to the proper officials.
