Isen Sounds Battle Cry In Red Cross Fund Drive

"Success... this year... is a must!" Such was the assertion of Chairman Albert Isen today, as he snapped the green light for Torrancia to join the rest of the Los Angeles area in officially launching the March 1956 Red Cross "twin goal" appeal for \$3,100,000 needed to continue financing the blood and community service programs, and \$238,000 to be allocated to the \$8,000,000 rehabilitation program in northern California.

With respect to Torrancia's fund campaign, Isen issued the following data:

Goal: \$15,965.

Slogan: "Keep Red Cross on the job for you—Give!"

1956 Motive: To help assure the operation of the following Red Cross service programs—blood, disaster-aid; armed forces; veterans; nursing, first aid, water safety, Junior Red Cross, community services, and international activities.

Immediate motive: To help rebuild the seriously depleted funds of the disaster aid service, which aside from conducting extensive flood-rehabilitation projects in northern California, is rendering \$3000 worth of financial aid to nine (9) Torrancia families affected by January's floods.

Strategy: To afford every Torrancia resident with an opportunity to make their 1956 Red Cross contribution; personal contacting to be done by 600 volunteers organized into the following four divisions—commerce and industry, residential, business, and advanced gifts.

Strategists: Al Hinz, commerce and industry chairman; Mrs. Grace Haggott, residential chairman; Mrs. Herma Tillim, residential vice-chairman; David Figueredo, business chairman; and Richard Pyle, advanced gifts chairman.

Special Event: Red Cross Blitz Week, when door-bell ringing volunteers will attempt to bring their quota in by the end of the week.

Local incentive: To repeat last year's record top production performance and keep the Earle M. Jorgenson trophy in Torrancia! (The trophy awarded annually to the Los Angeles community turning in the highest percentage of their goal, was presented to Isen when he turned in a 111 percent goal report on March 31, 1955.)

Other communities taking part in the Southwest Region's Red Cross appeal for an all-high goal of \$88,500 include—Lomita, \$985; Palos Verdes, \$9625; Inglewood-Lennox, \$22,510; Southbay, \$14,385; South Los Angeles, \$8180; Gardena, \$6135; Hawthorne, \$4680; and Lawndale, \$1100.

Bullets. From Speeding Car Wound Boy

Torrancia police noted a new chapter in the recent outbreak of gang warfare when a Torrancia youth was wounded by shots fired from a passing car, Wednesday night, February 22.

The victim was helping four young friends push a stalled car along 203rd and Arlington ave., when a 1937-39 model sedan pulled up along side them, they said. Gunfire blazed from the car windows, and the sedan sped on.

The boys were unable to detect the identity or number of passengers in the sedan, due to the speed of the get-away.

Bullets struck the victim in the right wrist, right thumb, and left cheek. The boy went to the Torrancia Police station after the attack and was rushed to the Torrancia Emergency hospital. Hospital attendants described his wounds as not serious, but painful.

The police said this was one more in the series of incidents occurring recently, which they fear indicate warfare between youth gangs in Torrancia, Gardena and South Los Angeles.

They pointed out a shooting which occurred in South Los Angeles about a month ago, and numerous beatings which have been reported.
