





FIREMEN COMPLETE TRAINING

Local firemen this week completed an advanced training program on procedures for the handling of natural gas, Fire Chief J. J. Benner announced today.

Jointly sponsored by the Southern California Gas co. and the fire department, the program stresses cooperation between gasmen and firemen in dealing with situations where natural gas is involved.

F. C. Dalley and G. L. Miller of the gas company conducted the training and discussion session. The presentation here, Chief Benner said, is part of a program being carried out by the gas company throughout its entire Southern California system.

Chief Benner explained: "Over 29,000 miles of pipelines are required to bring gas to the estimated population of five million served by Southern California Gas company. Within this vast network of gas mains and service lines, difficulties are certain to arise at times and with this course with the gas company we are working out control procedures."


