

FOUR-PLACE BREAK

Police Officer Albert Winkler, 35, of 2008 Kathy Way, had his leg broken in four places Friday afternoon when a car driven by Arthur Perry Collins, 33, of Redondo Beach, collided with Winkler's three-wheeled motorcycle. The accident occurred at Mul-len ave. near Border ave. Winkler was not thrown off the motorcycle despite the impact.

Policemen Cleared

Long Beach Superior Court cleared two police officers of man-handling and false arrest charges brought against them by a 26-year-old Torrance woman. The charges were brought against Sgt. Willis E. Platt and Officer Donald E. Phelps of Long Beach by Mrs. Millicent A. Wilson of 3321 W. 180th St. Mrs. Wilson sought a \$30,157 settlement claiming she was falsely charged with being drunk in 1953 and for back injuries which she sustained as a result of the arrest. Sgt. Platt refuted Mrs. Wilson's charges that 1) the two officers failed to show police identification; 2) were told by her that she was 25; 3) dragged her outside a cafe when they questioned her about her age; 4) held her against a wall and shook her; 5) put a knee in her back while handcuffing her; 6) used abusive language; 7) man-handled her; or 8) falsely arrested her. A municipal court jury later acquitted Mrs. Wilson on the drunk charge. Sgt. Platt said the woman showed all usual symptoms of being drunk. He testified the only force used was when she resisted while being taken to a police squad car and that it was just enough to subdue her. The case was heard in Judge Ralph K. Pierson's court.

PLACE DENTURES IMMEDIATELY AFTER EXTRACTION

Question—"What is an immediate denture?" asks Mrs. L. R., of Harbor City.

Answer—An immediate denture is one where the remaining natural teeth are removed and the denture is placed directly in the mouth, so the patient does not have to go without teeth.

Usually the front teeth are left. Then when the denture is ready, these are extracted and the denture inserted.

As the gums heal, the denture will gradually loosen up and sore spots may develop as the denture continues to settle. If the denture becomes too loose, your dentist may recommend some form of adhesive to help you until the gums are completely healed.

The denture can then be refitted, or in cases where the change is so great that the bite has changed, the dentures may have to be remade.




