## Parks, Playgrounds and Recreation

### Madrona And Fern-Greenwood

Serving the recreational needs of the children of the central Torrance area are the playgrounds under the operation of the Torrance Recreation Department at Madrona and Fern-Greenwood schools.

As far as physical facilities are concerned there are similarities at these two schools. Both have the usual facilities of playground apparatus, ball diamonds, basketball courts, craft and movie rooms, and even handball or paddleball courts. They offer the usual free play type of games that consist of playground balls, jump ropes, carroms, checkers, chess, maze and, at Madrona, miniature golf in which carroms are used.

The weekly programs at Madrona and Fern-Greenwood are general in nature to the extent that both playgrounds offer programs in crafts, organized games, and special events. The special events include talent shows, pet shows, cook-outs, tournaments, circuses and surprise days, in which nobody knows what will occur except the recreation leaders.

Special events that both school playgrounds will be concerned with include an "open house" crafts show at the Civic Auditorium on August 24 during the afternoon and a party at each area during the final week of the summer recreation program to be announced in the weekly recreation calendar.

The director at Fern-Greenwood School is Darold Kusch who also teaches there.

One of the student leaders on the playground is Michaelle Silver who is attending El Camino College and majoring in primary education. Rounding off the staff is student leader Gayle Carothers a graduate of North high school and also bound for El Camino.

Madrona school has as its director Cy LeVine who teaches there. The student leaders are Judy Reid, a student at Santa Barbara State College, majoring

in education, and Sherwood Tierman, a graduate of Torrance high and planning on attending El Camino college.
