 have to be opened and closed so often over a long period of time.
Sumps Necessary
 To questions whether the drainage sump could be eliminated and another means of drainage found, Blount replied that drainage sumps are necessary, unfortunately.
 Other means of flood control are expensive and require long-range planning involving the city, the country, and the Flood Control District.
 This would require a multi-million dollar bond issue. Residents might also form an assessment district, but here again the cost would be great.
 Blount, however, promised that he would investigate whether the water could be spread out over the whole area rather than localized in the four to five-foot deep section, thus making it shallower.
 "Nothing we can do can undo the tragedy which has struck us," Blount said, referring to the tragedy. "A great cloud came over the city when this happened."
