Talking About The Weather

Today should be partly cloudy but mostly sunny. The evenings should be fairly cool but with fairly warm daytime temperatures. There should be little or no change in tomorrow's weather with the exception of some increasing clouds. Rain has dominated the weather scene for the past week in Torrance. Last week's storm's total and also the month's total stands at .81 of an inch. It all started in the early morning hours last Thursday, when .24 of an inch of rain fell. During the morning and afternoon hours there were intermittent "April showers" with

changes from bright sunlight to pouring rain which is characteristic of April.

The next day, Friday, started out partly cloudy. The clouds thickened throughout the day with very dark clouds appearing in the evening.

Saturday was cloudy in the morning with rain beginning about 10 p.m. which continued until nearly 2 p.m. There were clouds but with no rain until almost 6 p.m., then a squall slammed into the coast and be-

gan moving this way. By six p.m. it was raining very hard with a 17 mph wind blowing. This lasted for nearly an hour and a half.

If anyone happened to be up at about 1 a.m. Sunday morning he would have seen bright flashes of lightning in the southwest. This intense squall appeared to be located north-west of Catalina Island over the ocean.

Easter Sunday in Torrance was partly cloudy in the morn-

ing but with clear skies in the afternoon. There were still some intense squalls in scattered sections throughout Southern California, however none of these came close to Torrance. These squalls were accompanied by hail, thunder, lightning and rain.

Monday was cloudy with a light rain beginning about 6 a.m. and continuing until about 7 a.m. The rest of the day was mostly cloudy but with no more rain.
