POWER SEWING CLASS AT ECC TURNS OUT MAN'S SHIRT EVERY 5 MINUTES

Most of the unique campus departments on display during El Camino's instructional exhibits May 10 and 12 will be power sewing, a class which turns out approximately 10,000 articles annually.

Under the guidance of Miss Marisa Patrizi, who has taught at the college for two and a half years, the class supplies goods for college use as well as selling items at cost to charitable organizations in the area.

Recently the group went into a production line basis for one week in speed tests and produced men's sport shirts at the rate of one every five minutes. The class, which consists of 20 women enrolled to learn a trade, produces varied sportswear for men, women, and children. Most of the women are middle-aged.

One of the phases of the course which Miss Patrizi stresses is familiarity of her students with the numerous specialized machines in operation at El Camino.

The newest addition to the department is a steam press. Besides standard single needle machines, other machines in the department include the overlock, overlock sew, double needle, blind stitch, zig-zag, embroidery, button hole and upholstery. The group also has
