They don't want to clean up after them and they have the pleasure of having the animals.

Why should the rest of us have to suffer and pay for their enjoyment? When is our fair city going to enforce the laws it passes? When are the dog catchers going to start earning their pay? I'm thoroughly disgusted.

San Pedro Hospital Drive Asked

The newly chartered Harbor Osteopathic hospital corp., today proposed to the San Pedro Community Hospital corporation that the two groups conduct a United Hospital fund drive to make certain that adequate funds are raised to build a community hospital to replace old San Pedro Hospital buildings recently condemned as unsafe.

The new non-profit corporation represents 50 Osteopathic physicians and surgeons in the Harbor-South Bay area, said Dr. Bryce Pizey, secretary.

In a conference with the San Pedro Hospital Fund drive committee composed of Pascal Dillard, Dr. Jesse Bloch and Bill Bullock, Dr. Pizey said the Osteopathic group wants to "wholeheartedly share in the drive" to complete a community hospital for all people of the area.

The formal communication presented to the committee headed by Dillard suggested that upon successful completion of the fund campaign either osteopathic patients be assigned a proportionate percentage of bed space in the new hospital and be represented on all governing hospital boards, or that a proportionate percentage of funds raised by public subscription and state and federal funds be assigned to build a hospital for area patients of osteopathic physicians.

The building fund committee headed by Dillard has reported it plans an early campaign to raise a minimum of \$300,000 to put with state and federal funds they hope to obtain in order to build a new 140-bed hospital.
