

TORRANCE TO ENTER ANNUAL COUNTY FAIR

Torrance will be represented for the first time at the Los Angeles County Fair in Pomona late this summer, it was announced today by Dr. Gerald M. Eastman, chairman of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce Advertising and Publicity committee.

Eastman said a display will be entered in the city and county class of competition and will be located in the Feature Exhibit Building at the world's largest county fair.

Chamber President A. E. Thompson added that the decision to enter competition was motivated by the success of the Torrance entry in the International Flower Show at Hollywood Park earlier this year in which a first place trophy was won.

"We have received complimentary acknowledgments from all sections of Southern California as a result of the Flower Show entry under chairmanship of Johnny Johnson," Thompson said.

He added "The Torrance Chamber of Commerce is determined to end the too often stated remark 'Where is Torrance' by taking the story of our city to the people."

The entry will consist of a

Huge "All-America City" shields will add color to the display.

Eastman said his committee not only intends to present a first-class entry but actually believes it will capture a prize.
