

### Radio Station Hearing Delayed Until June 27

The Federal Communication Commission postponed a hearing to allow establishment of a radio station in Torrance until June 27, according to Dick Fitzgerald, manager of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce. Charles R. Bramlett, prospec-

tive owner-operator, told Fitzgerald he has a good chance of getting the permit, but three other stations have also filed with the FCC for a similar permit. Fitzgerald explained that it is difficult to get FCC approval on new stations in California because only one more station is allowed due to an already-crowded wave band.

Findings indicate: 393 homes, 320 autos, 32 stores and shops, \$750,000 in retail sales, 24 professional men, 6600 acres of farm products, 18 teachers, 22 school rooms, \$2,500,000 in tax ratables, \$1,500,000 in life insurance, 1400 population, and \$1,000,000 in bank deposits.
