

Reporting System Will Be Revised

Now that the Reporting Committee has finished its work, school officials are thinking in terms of four steps to carry the committee's recommendations to completion.

These are: 1) Summer school principals will study the proposals and suggest plans for carrying them out; 2) teachers will be consulted for their opinions and recommendations in September; 3) findings will be submitted to the superintendent of schools; and 4) his recommendations will be placed before the Board of Education for action.

These are the tentative plans, according to Acting Superintendent Al Posner.

The most challenging job, Posner feels, is working out a satisfactory guide for the written progress report.

"I hope we can avoid 'standard phrases.' There are several ways of telling someone that his or her child is a slow learner, for instance. That's what we're going to try to emphasize, so that we won't have to rely on pat phrases and get into the rut that we were in before," he said.

Everyone is enthusiastic about making this reappraisal of the reporting system from the principals on down, he said.


