

## Garbage Collection Service Includes Pickup of Rubbish

Many residents living within the ten garbage disposal districts of Los Angeles County are not aware that their collection service includes pickup of all types of rubbish as well as garbage.

**Request for Information**  
Dr. Roy O. Gilbert, County Health Officer, who is charged with the coordination of collection services, said that the term, "Garbage Disposal District," has led to a flood of telephone calls requesting information as to what to do with paper and rubbish.

The Health Officer said that collection service within these districts is complete and that there is no need for any resident to use an incinerator.

**No Limit to Containers**  
Combustible rubbish such as paper, wood, rags, and garden clippings, together with non-combustible materials such as cans, bottles, metal and glass, are collected in every garbage disposal district once each week. Containers may not exceed 12 cubic feet in size and, when loaded, not over 40 pounds in weight. There is no limit on the number of containers to be set out for collection.

Collection of garbage is made twice each week. Leak-proof metal containers, equipped with handles or bail and tight fitting lids are required.

**Taxes Pay for Service**  
The cost of collection services in these Districts is added to property taxes in the form of a special assessment tax. collection days, Dr. Gilbert suggested that residents call the contractor serving the District in which they live. For Torrance information, call Arthur Kazarian, ORegion 8-2718.
