Torrance Delegates to Model Legislature Get Experience

With the theme "Democracy must be learned by each generation," still in their thoughts, the Torrance delegates returned from the 10th California YMCA Model Legislature held at the State Capitol, February 13-15.

Along with several hundred other high school delegates Judy Arnold, Senator; Gladys Hilton, Assemblyman; Colleen Hilton, Legislative Advocate, and Judi LeClaire, Legislative Aide, took part in the fascinating experience of seeing a bill through all the way from introduction in committee, to debate in the Senate and Assembly and to the final signing by the youth Governor. Each step of the process called for careful preparation and presentation. Other delegates had to be encouraged to support the bills and arguments against the bills had to be answered. This involved dozens of personal contacts and continual "button-holing" of delegates. Because of the keen competition and sharp debating only 12 of 58 bills submitted were signed by the youth Governor.

Along with all of the hard work the delegates enjoyed a fine recreation program the highlight of which was the Governor's Ball on Friday evening. Among the principle speakers who addressed the Model Legislature were Governor Goodwin Knight and Ralph Kirkwood, State Controller. Chief Justice Earl Warren sent his greetings and expressed his endorsement for the Youth and Government program.

The Torrance delegates were sponsored by the Rotary Club who contributed \$178 and Hermosa Imports who loaned a station wagon for the trip.

U.S. Savings Bond Sales Show Big Increase

United States Savings Bonds registered a healthy increase in sales in Southern California during the first month of 1958, according to figures released today by the Federal Reserve Bank.

Sales for Series E and H Savings Bonds for Southern California for January, just audited from field reports, were \$19,843,563 as compared to \$16,104,463 for the same month of 1957. The increase amounted to 23%.

Nationally, the holdings of E and H bonds by the public have set an all time record of nearly \$41.7 billion, said W. F. Volbers, Vice-President and Manager of the Los Angeles Branch, Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco.
