Dr. Moshos Names Top Leaders for Red Cross; Clay Addresses Leaders

Moving resolutely to organize the essential volunteer forces for Torrance's Red Cross fund appeal, Chairman Dr. Don Moshos today announced the line-up of local campaign leaders who were expected to attend today's pre-fund raising luncheon honoring General Lucius D. Clay, chairman of next month's national appeal for the organization.

A former commander in chief of the U.S. forces in Europe and aide to President Eisenhower, Clay is slated to outline in detail the current needs of the Red Cross demanding next month's expanded fund appeal before more than 500 of Los Angeles area's campaign leaders at the Stailer Hotel affair.

Major fund raising units in Torrance will be organized and directed by the following appointed by Dr. Moshos: Mrs. Mary Pagan of 1528 Post ave., residential chairman; Ray Wyatt, Assistant postmaster, business chairman; Harvey D. McCafferty, manager of the Torrance Medical Group, professional chairman; and Mrs. Millie West, publicity chairman.

Dr. Moshos explained that today's luncheon in Los Angeles will concentrate move expanded organization of volunteers "which is already underway in Torrance."

"Because we feel that raising an "expanded goal" this year is mandatory," we are currently concentrating our efforts on forming an "expanded army of volunteers, the only sure means

of carrying out this mandate," he claimed. In conclusion, he indicated that the completion of local campaign plans are pending the organization of volunteer ranks.

Parking Banned at Lomita School

Daytime parking during week days on the north side of 247th street between the west property line of Narbonne avenue and a point in excess of 300 feet west of the property line will be prohibited, according to an order approved by Supervisor Burton W. Chace Tuesday.

Harbor College Breaks Record For Enrollment

Total enrollment for the Spring semester at Harbor College has topped all previous records since the opening of the college in September, 1949, Coordinator Robert V. Bacon of the Office of Admissions and Guidance said today.

According to official records, 1,382 students have registered in day classes and 2,124 in evening classes, bringing the total to 3,506 students on campus, an increase of 250, or approximately 8%, over the enrollment for the Fall semester. Men outnumber women students by approximately three to one in all classes.

"The results of advance registration indicate that we enrolled more students than ever before and with less inconvenience to students than in any previous mid-year registration," Mr. Bacon stated.

"Advance registration is apparently going to be with us from now on since we are pleased with the way enrollment proceeded. The advantage of early registration for the Fall semester, 1958-59, will be that students will be able to sign up for all the classes they want. Advance registration will take place in May and during the summer," Mr. Bacon added.
