Osteopaths Plan Hospital Benefit

Presentation of a musical comedy "Take Your Medicine" on September 4-6, at the Redondo Union High School auditorium is expected to raise an initial \$5,000 toward a goal of \$150,000 sought to furnish and equip the new \$1,100,000 Bay Harbor Osteopathic Hospital to be built soon in Harbor City. It was announced today by Dr. C. R. Houske.

"We feel that people should be offered something in return for their support of our new hospital and we have endeavored to bring to the area, one of the best entertainment programs available," Dr. Houske said.

The comedy is a satire about hospitals, doctors and nurses and is especially appropriate as its plot is wound around the problems of raising money for hospital purposes.

"Take Your Medicine" comes to the Bay-Harbor area from packed house performances in Pasadena. Its professional cast of more than 20 players has played with the Theatre Americana and the Pasadena Playhouse.
