

Housing medical and dental suites and a pharmacy, structure was designed by Harris, Rice & Campbell, architects, A.I.A.

New \$600,000 Medical Center to Be Built on Airport Triangle

Facilities of Crenshaw Pacific Center, extensive new shopping and commercial development now under construction in Torrance, will be enhanced with addition of a \$600,000 medical building, it was announced yesterday by master developer, Jefferson, Inc., headed by Albert Leavitt and James S. Bower.

Plans and specifications are being prepared by architects Harris, Rice & Campbell, A.I.A., for a two-story steel frame structure containing 27,000 square feet of rentable area.

The building will have medical and dental suites, a pharmacy, and will be served by one elevator. It will be completely air-conditioned, adjoining it will be maximum parking space. When completed the structure will have a two-story panel of brilliantly colored ceramic veneer accentuating the entrance. There will be terrazzo flooring in the lobby. The building, fronting on Crenshaw Blvd., will be just north of Pacific Coast Hwy. adjoining the shopping district.

Russell Dymock Smith, retiring president of the Palos Verdes Estates Chamber of Commerce and head of the Smith Realty Co., has been named leasing agent.

Crenshaw Pacific Center will serve the Torrance-Lomita-Palos Verdes-Rolling Hills-South Bay district from its 36-acre triangular site bounded by Pacific Coast Hwy on the south, Crenshaw Blvd. on the west, and the Lomita-Torrance boundary line on the east. Twenty-four acres will be devoted to shopping structures, with remaining space being given over to parking areas and professional and commercial buildings.
