

Rolling Hills Estates wants some assurance of engineering help before it agrees to the extension of Hawthorne Blvd., through its city limits.
That was the nutshell of a resolution in which the City Council pointed out that it wants assurances that the extension of Hawthorne will not bring additional congestion within its city limits.
Torrance and the County have pressed for the opening of Hawthorne Blvd. to the ocean as a means of expediting traffic in the Palos Verdes Peninsula.
But Rolling Hills officials said that traffic engineering will have to be done on Palos Verdes North to eliminate some of the congestion.
