

Canned Goods, Togs Needed for Navajos

The Torrance YMCA gave a final appeal for toys, canned goods, clothes and candy today. The gifts will be delivered by the 'Y' teen-agers to the Navajo Indians at Monument Valley, Arizona, through this month.

Jim Oliver, nation chief, for the 'Y' Indian Guides, reminded Torrance residents that gifts for 500 Indians are required.

Though clothing has been received, canned goods, toys, and candy are still needed.

Heading the list of necessary food items are canned fruits and milk, he added.

Oliver reminded citizens that the Indians cannot read English and that gifts requiring reading are impractical. Toys such as dolls, balls, toy autos and guns are hoped to arrive before the mercy trip is launched on Dec. 27.
