## New Equipment to Aid Surgeons in Operating on Heart Conditions

For children in need of heart surgery at Harbor General Hospital, the Charity Champagne Preview of the Broadway Del Amo store on Feb. 15 will be more than an exciting social event.

It will mean a chance for a normal life.

Four new pieces of equipment will be donated the hospital through the proceeds of the Preview.

### New Equipment

A Bennett Assistor, to control the patient's respiration while under surgery, a Therm-O-Rite machine for lowering body temperature, an Eden Anestograph, to check on the condition of the patient throughout the operation and a To and Fro Absorber used for heart operations involving children and infants.

The equipment won't lack use, already there are children on the list whose parents are unable to afford the cost of private hospitalization. It may be their only hope.

The additions in cardiac instruments will enable Harbor General to do the work a hospital of its size should handle.


The hospital serves 100,000 people in the area, all of whom are unable to pay for private treatment.
