**Nevada Phone Numbers to Be Changed**

Nevada 6 prefix telephone numbers in Torrance will change to Spruce 5 numbers in September, Dick Pyle, Pacific Telephone manager announced this week.

The change is being made because of increasing demands for Los Angeles exchange service in the Harbor area, Pyle explained. New equipment will be added to that now in use.

Los Angeles exchange service in Torrance, Lomita, Wilmington and San Pedro is identified by the Nevada 6 number. The new Spruce 5 number will be served from the central office at 1418 Broad Avenue in Wilmington.

More than 800 Nevada-6 telephone users will be affected by the change. New Spruce 5 telephone numbers will be mailed to local customers prior to the change of prefixes. Fairfax telephones in the number change, he said.


**Welfare Drive Mop-up Slated**
