

Annual Youth Band Concert to Feature Competition Winners

The 13th anniversary concert by the Torrance Area Youth Band will be presented May 22 instead of May 23 as originally scheduled. The place for the concert is also changed to the Torrance Civic Auditorium.

Featured soloists for the concert will be winners of the music competition scholarships, including Ronnie Van Dyck, winner of the wind instrument division; Peter Bailey, who topped the field of string players, and Patricia Patterson, first-place winner in the piano division. All three winners have been given cash scholarships of \$100 each by the Junior Woman's Club of Torrance, which co-sponsored the music competitions and the artist series with the Youth Band.

An added feature of the concert will be the appearance of Charles Brady, one of the nation's leading young trumpet players. Brady will perform the Concerto for Trumpet by Eugene Bozza. This number is used as an entrance examination for trumpet players to the Paris Conservatory of Music.

Numbers to be performed by the band include "Proud Heritage" march, "Die Fledermaus" overture, "My Fair Lady" selections, "Symphonic Songs" by Robert Russell Bennett, who re-

cently scored the picture, "Victory at Sea" "Il Seraglio" overture by Mozart, and "La Fiesta Mexicana."

Jim Davidson, director of the "Fun Through Music" program of the Recreation Department, will be guest conductor.

The Youth Band mothers will hold a reception for members of the Junior Woman's Club in the auditorium immediately following the concert.

Holdings of season tickets will be admitted free to the concert. Individual concert admission has been scaled down for this concert to \$1 for adults and 50 cents for students. Starting time for the concert is 8 p. m.

Nevada-6 prefix telephone numbers in Torrance will change to SPruce-5 numbers in September. Dick Pyle, Pacific Telephone manager, announced this week.

The change is being made because of increasing demands for Los Angeles exchange service in the Harbor area, Pyle explained. New equipment will be added to that now in use.

Los Angeles exchange service in Torrance, Lomita, Wilmington and San Pedro is identified by the NEvada-6 number. The new SPruce-5 number will be served from the central office at 1418 Broad Avenue in Wilmington.

More than 800 Nevada-6 telephone users will be affected by the change.

New SPruce-5 telephone numbers will be mailed to local customers prior to the change of prefixes. Fairfax telephones in Torrance will not be affected by the number change, he said.
