Ryan to Develop Two Systems for Firebee Ground Launching

Ryan Aeronautical Company will develop two systems for ground-launching its famed Firebee jet targets for the U.S. Army Rocket and Guided Missile Agency, Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, it was announced recently. Rail and "zero-length" launching systems will be employed.

Firebees will be catapulted into the air by jet assist take-offs (JATO). The Firebee's jet engine will then take over as the speedy target is directed on its mission by a ground remote controller.

A rail launcher, about 80 feet long, will be used initially, and a "zero-length" launch system will be developed during the project's second phase.

Ground-launching will increase the versatility of the Firebees, supplementing the present method of air launching from "mother planes," utilized by the Army, Air Force, Navy and RCAF.

In the first phase of the testing program, to be conducted at the Army's White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico, XM21 Firebees among the first target missiles built by Ryan—will be

used with the rail launcher, scheduled to go into operation later this year.

Later, the newer Q-2A Firebees (Army designation: Model 61-E) will go into service with the "zero" launcher, a mobile system which will enable the Army to send up free-flying targets from various locations to provide realistic targets for evaluation of its surface-to-air missile systems.
