

Girl Wins Award in Shooting

A girl wounded by a cold-blooded youth in a shooting spree a year ago, Tuesday was awarded a \$25,000 judgement against her assailant.

Superior Judge Eugene P. Fay made the award in behalf of Susan Elaine Slover, 16, of 5229 Bindewald Ave., who was critically wounded in the shooting. She is a South High School senior now.

The judgement was rendered against Wilburn Anthony Henderson, now 17, who was sentenced to an indefinite term in a

State industrial school. A judgement against the boy's mother, Mrs. Violet Wilson of Colorado, is also under submission until Judge Fay can rule on legal technicalities concerning non-residency.

Miss Slover, who was represented by Attorney Boris Woolley, was hospitalized for several weeks after she was shot in the chest by Henderson.

The Colorado youth had driven here in his stepfather's car and visited the girl whom he met casually two years before.

Before the afternoon of terror on Aug. 28, ended, Henderson shot Miss Slover and pistol-whipped another boy who came to her assistance.

Henderson was arrested while walking along the Esplanade when an alert policeman noticed his white shoes. The youth had changed all his other clothes, and dyed his hair in efforts to escape detection.

Half-Way Mark of Osteopath Hospital to Be Breakfast Theme

Plans to welcome more than 700 people to a special "Victory Breakfast" at the Bay Harbor Osteopathic Hospital now under construction at 1437 Lomita Boulevard, in Harbor City, on Sunday Sept. 20, were announced yesterday by Mrs. Louise Third of Lomita, local chairman of breakfast ticket sales, and will be served from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Breakfast of hot cakes, ham and eggs, fruit juice and coffee is being prepared by a corps of hospital workers headed by Mrs. Louise Smith and Earl Johansen of San Pedro.

Drs. Chesley Houske and Frederick Stange of Torrance, members of the board of directors of the Bay Harbor Osteopathic Hospital, pointed out that the breakfast is being staged to acquaint sponsors and supporters of the project with its progress.

Building work on the \$779,054 one story 50-bed structure, is approximately 50 per cent completed and present plans call for the opening of the hospital about Jan. 1, the doctors report. Payments of more than \$300,000 have been made to the contractor Ernest W. Hahn, and the hos-

pital board has received more than \$200,000 from state and federal Hill-Burton Funds. A total of \$594,882 was allocated to the project by the Hill-Burton Fund group.
