Space Vehicle Fuel Plant Groundbreaking Rite Held

Groundbreaking ceremonies for a multi-million dollar liquid hydrogen plant at Hawthorne Blvd. and 190th St., were held Tuesday, marking commencement of a facility that will provide up to 3.3 million pounds of liquid hydrogen annually to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

Linde Company, Division of Union Carbide Corporation, is constructing the plant on a five-acre site adjacent to Union Carbide Chemicals Corporation.

Completion is scheduled for May, 1960. Although most of the liquid hydrogen produced will go to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration as a source of fuel for rockets, missiles and space vehicles, additional quantities of the high energy, cryogenic fluid will also be available to other consumers in the West.

Mayor Albert Isen of Torrance and J. H. Paget, president of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, together with Linde Company officials, L. W. Jordan, T. F. O'Connell and Richard C. Barrett, gas products manager for the Los Angeles region, participated in the event.

A symbolic silver cylinder, similar to the containers utilized for storing and transporting cryogenic fluids, was presented to

Mayor Isen by L. W. Jordan, vice president of Linde Company, during the ceremony.
