

\$4 Million Job in Palos Verdes Apartment Plans

A prominent New York real estate developer, Sidney M. Barton, has purchased land in Palos Verdes for immediate construction of 250 deluxe-type apartment units, it was announced this week.

The site at Indian Peak Rd. and Hawthorne Blvd., said to be valued at nearly \$500,000, was acquired from Palos Verdes Properties, Inc. Barton will be associated in the venture with Jerry Moss, Beverly Hills land developer. It was stated that the completed project will represent an investment of approximately \$4 million.

Barton, who heads the Sidney M. Barton Co. of New York, said that construction plans call for an architectural decor that will harmonize with the picturesque setting of surrounding Palos Verdes hills, known for its fashionable homes.

"The meteorological map showing absence of smog in Palos Verdes counted as much as the majestic coastline in dictating the selection of this site for apartment construction," Barton stated. He observed that the nearness of boating marinas and golf courses are other inducements to apartment living in this area. The apartment units will have terraces overlooking the sea.

The apartment site is within walking distance of the Palos Verdes Peninsula Town Center which will comprise a regional shopping center, office buildings, medical units and recreational facilities. It also adjoins the recently announced Research and Development Park, whose campus-like grounds are expected to be the mecca for the nation's leading scientists.

46th District GOP Backs Candidate Charles Chapel
