

Drama by El Camino Student Slated for Television Premiere

"Brick and the Rose," a play written by Lewis John Carlinio, former El Camino honor-student, will appear on television Jan. 24 on Channel 2 at noon.

The premiere presentation of the CBS Television Workshop will feature a New York cast. The program was designed to develop new writing and directing talent.

A graduate of El Camino and USC and winner of a 1958 Huntington Hartford playwriting grant, Carlinio has had his plays produced many times around the Los Angeles area.

The play was originally performed at USC, under the direction of the author. Using the same cast, Carlinio presented his play at the Ivar Theatre in Hollywood.

During El Camino's first summer stock session, Carlinio brought his directing talent back to El Camino to lead the student actors in presenting "Brick" and "Junkyard," another of his plays.

Sidney Blackmar headed the cast which presented Carlinio's play at the Ritz Theater. Following this, it was again revived at El Camino the next year.

The latest presentations of the play were given at the Projection Booth in Laguna and at the In-Somiac Coffee House in Hermosa, with past and present El Camino students taking part.

Dealing with the life of a character named Tommy, "Brick and the Rose" is the story of a young man who tries to find one rose in a city of brick.

No Housing Shortage for Winter Games

SQUAW VALLEY, Calif. — Rumors that there is a critical shortage of spectator housing for the VIII Olympic Winter Games are completely false, according to George Goldworthy, Organizing Committee Housing Director. Accommodations at reasonable rates are available as close as the North Shore of Lake Tahoe, 20 miles from the Squaw Valley Olympic Games site. Further, housing is available for short as well as long stays. Sacramento area hotels and motels still have accommodations on a one-night basis over the Washington's Birthday weekend, Feb. 19, 20, and 21. Hotels and motels in nearly all areas will take weekend reservations on both the first and second weekends of the Games.

In order to assure housing for spectators at reasonable rates, the Organizing Committee has signed Housing Agreements with hotels and motels from the following areas: Truckee; North Shore of Lake Tahoe, Reno, Carson City, South Shore of Lake Tahoe, Auburn, Grass Valley, Sacramento, Placerville, Sierra, Sierra City, Quincy, and Susanville. Bus transportation is available from almost all of these areas.

Stock Cars to Resume Sunday

Postponed because of rain last weekend, the NASCAR late model stock cars open their '60 season Sunday afternoon with an eight race program starting at 2:15 p.m. at Ascot Stadium.

Highlighting the afternoon will be special match races between a '60 Ford, a '60 Chevrolet and a '60 Dodge piloted by top NASCAR chaffers.

The race marks not only the opening of the '60 season, but is the first in a series of eight NASCAR late model stock car races to be staged at the Ascot oval by promoters Bob Barkhimer and Tony Coldewey.
