Temple Menorah Slates Ground Breaking Rites

"Ground breaking and consecration ceremonies of the new Temple Menorah building will take place Feb. 21st at 2 p.m. at the site of the property on Sepulveda Blvd. near Prospect Ave.," announced George Lewison, president of the congregation.

Temple Menorah, serving Jewish persons living in Redondo Beach, Torrance, Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, Rolling Hills and Palos Verdes, was organized in 1946 by 15 families.

In 1947 the group was affiliated with the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, the parent body of Reform Jewish congregations in the United States.

Isaac Grancell and his wife purchased the old Odd Fellows Hall at 112 N. Catalina Ave. in Redondo Beach in 1946. It was remodeled and became known as the South Bay Jewish Community Center and Temple Menorah.

As the activities of the organization increased more families joined until in 1947 the organization had approximately 50 member families.

By this time the women had formed a Sisterhood affiliated with the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, an official arm of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations. Under the guidance of the Sisterhood a religious school was organized and became a part of the Los Angeles Bureau of Jewish Education.

Two youth groups were formed for the teenagers of the congregation, the Temple Menorah Juniors, Menorah Federation of Temple Youth. Both are affiliated with the National Federation of Temple Youth.

In 1959 the Men's Club came into existence. It is affiliated with the National Federation of Temple Brotherhoods.

Three years ago Temple Menorah engaged the services of Rabbi Henri E. Front. The Rabbi, a graduate of the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, had just been released from the United States Navy Corps of Chaplains in which he had served as a chaplain with the Marines. The Temple now numbered more than 200 member families with 225 children attending religious school and Hebrew classes.

The Temple Menorah Choir was founded in January 1958. Harry Newman was selected as cantorial soloist and his wife, Fay, was appointed director.
