### Pupils to Keep Investment Program, Even With a Loss

Undismayed by slight losses, members of the Madrona School Alumni Stockholders Club voted last week to keep their faith—and their money—invested in a share of Kaiser Aluminum.

A year ago, 22 members of Roy Adamson's eighth-grade class at Madrona School formed a stock club as the result of their studies of the stock market.

After intensive study, they voted to invest in one share of Kaiser Aluminum, which they got for just over \$50. Youngsters invested \$2 or \$3 apiece.

When they met a year later, they found themselves with a net loss of about two cents apiece. The stock had fluctuated considerably. In late 1959, it rose to \$67 a share, but in March, it fell to \$44. At the time of the meeting, Kaiser Aluminum was selling for 48.50.

On their stock investment, each child lost about a nickel, but as a result of three quarterly dividends of 23 cents each, the net loss per student was only about two cents.

At the meeting, most of the young stockholders indicated their faith in the future of their stock by voting to maintain the investment. Four students, however, wanted to sell, so their interests were bought out by eager classmates. Dennis Dyer brought
