

El Camino Presents Physics Courses for People, Not Pros

Presentation of a new course in physics for the general public rather than for science and engineering majors will be made at El Camino College for the first time this fall.

"This course is unlike any ordinary course in physics," William T. Mooney Jr., assistant director of instruction, explained. "It might well be called Physics for People, for this is precisely its intent."

It is intended for those who have neither the background nor the interest nor the need nor the mathematical background for the ordinary physics course," Mooney elaborated.

Since the body of knowledge called "physics" has been put together by people, the students in the new course will explore biographically and historically the man who made physics. Students will become acquainted with Archimedes, Galileo, Newton, Kepler, Copernicus, and scores of others and their contributions to physics and present-day culture.

The instructor for Physics II this semester will be Julius Summer Miller, a member of the faculty who has been engaged by CBS Television Network for a new series en-

titled "Great Events in Science." Miller has done, over the past several years, the CBS show, "Why Is It So?"

Physics II will be offered on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 6:30 to 8 p.m. Students may inquire in the Registration Office for information concerning enrollment.

Lord that hath mercy on thee."


