Regular weekly meeting of the Torrance City Council, normally scheduled for Tuesday evening, will be adjourned until Wednesday evening at 8 p.m. in the council chambers, 3031 Torrance Blvd.

On Friday, Veterans Day, an official holiday, rubbish will not be collected in the city. Normal pickup will be made on Monday. Rubbish collection for the week of November 14 to 19 will be one day later than the normal pickup.
