Indianapolis race drivers, headed by A. J. Foyt of Houston, Tex., point leader for the national championship, are remaining in Southern California to compete Saturday night, Nov. 12, at Ascot Stadium in J. C. Agajanian's USAC sprint car program.

The seven-event card, topped by the 14-car 40-lap main event, was postponed one week due to weather conditions last weekend.

Racing experts predict a terrific four-way fight in the main event between Foyt, eastern sprint car champion; Don Branson of Champaign, Ill., fourth-place finisher in this year's Indianapolis race; and the two Southland favorites, Parnelli Jones of Torrance and Jim Hurtubise of Lennox.

Jones won USAC's midwestern championship this year, while the sensational Hurtubise is the fastest qualifier in Indianapolis racing history. Lloyd Ruby of Houston, Tex., seventh in this year's Indy race; Bud Tingelstad of Dayton, Ohio, ninth in the same race; Elmer George, Speedway, Ind.; Wayne Weiler, Phoenix Ariz.; and Jimmy Davies, Gardena, are a few


