

No Change Shown in Employment Rolls for Month

Irving H. Perluss, director of employment, reported this week that the number of persons employed in the Los Angeles - Long Beach - Orange County area showed virtually no change between September and October. The overall gain of 200 was a less-than-seasonal increase for the period, but the employment total of 2,755,000 represented a new record for the area. Unemployment edged down from 157,900 in September to 156,100 in October, and the rate of joblessness remained at 5.4 per cent.

Cutbacks in construction, agriculture and related activities offset gains in durable good manufacturing and in the schools to result in a leveling off in total employment during the past month. The principal manufacturing increases occurred in the electrical machinery and automobile industries. The outstanding development, however, was the fact that aircraft, after twelve consecutive months of retrenchment, stabilized between September and October. Nevertheless, the employment level in this industry continued to reflect a long-term weakness and was off by more than 15 per cent over the past year. Mainly because of this influence, the growth in total employment since last October held at a moderate 51,200, or 1.9 per cent.

Influenced principally by the withdrawal of temporary workers from the labor force, unemployment dropped to 156,100 in October from 157,900 in September. The current volume, however, was 47 percent greater than the 106,200 reported in October 1959. The unemployment rate was up from 3.8 to 5.4 percent over the year.
