

Plan Street Construction For Carson, Lomita Areas

Supervisor Burton W. Chace announced this week several improvements to be made in the area.

In the Carson area pavement widening on the east side of Avalon Blvd. from 190th St. to Elsmere Drive will begin immediately.

When complete, it will help the flow of traffic in the growing Carson area.

TRAFFIC SURVEY
According to recent traffic surveys Avalon Blvd., a major highway on the County master plan, is used by more than 10,000 vehicles daily from 190th St. to Elsmere Drive.

Also in the Carson area it was announced that street lights have been proposed for New Hampshire Ave., Doble Ave., Jeffery Ave., Payne Ave., and 214th St. in the area between 208th and 214th Streets.

Pointing out that residential street lighting must be paid for by residents themselves, Chace noted that the signatures of the owners of at least 60 per cent of the taxable property within the area are required before the proposals can be presented to the Board of Supervisors for further action.

A petition has been prepared at the request of Mrs. Harold Malin, 21287 S. Doble

Ave. She should be contacted for further information concerning the street lighting, Chace said.

Included in his announcement was the work on the widening of Eshelman Ave. northerly of Allbrook St. will begin this week.

Chace said Eshelman Ave. is a Secondary highway on the County master plan, with recent traffic counts indicating that approximately 3,000 vehicles use this portion daily.

Supervisor Chace urged drivers to exercise caution when travelling through the construction area.

PLANTING YEAR-ROUND

'Green Light' Given Development Of Hawthorne Shopping District

Work on development of Hawthorne Blvd. a half-mile south of Pacific Coast Highway is expected to begin within 90 days, it was announced yesterday by Councilman J. A. Beasley.

The county has completed its preliminary plan to widen the boulevard to Newton St. as part of a project that will extend Hawthorne Blvd. to North Palos Verdes Drive North in the hills.

The majority of property owners in the area favor an assessment district to provide street lighting on both sides as well as 10-foot sidewalks and ornamental trees, Beasley said after a meeting with merchants and businessmen in the area.

"This will result in an area of great charm and appeal and give us perhaps the finest walking area in Torrance for shoppers."

Beasley said the triangular green just south of Pacific Coast Highway will give way to parking space, and unsightly utility poles will be removed on both sides of the street.

He noted that development of the boulevard through the hills will give residents of Palos Verdes easy access to the shopping centers of Torrance.

Local Branch of County Marshal's Office Opens in Torrance This Week

Joe Bookman, Los Angeles County Marshal, this week announced the opening of another divisional office in the ever expanding chain of marshal's offices throughout the county.

Effective last Tuesday, this new office, located at 3231 Torrance Blvd., Torrance, will be the 28th branch marshal's office located within Los Angeles County. Division Commander will be Lt. Arnold Strasser, a veteran of 13 years in the marshal's department. Lt. Strasser is being transferred from the Alhambra division where he also served as commander.

New Torrance office will serve civil process in an area bounded by Victor St. on the west, Vermont Ave. on the east, Rosecrans Blvd. on the north and the northern boundary of the Palos Verdes Estates on the south. This area which includes the cities of Torrance, Gardena and Lawndale was formerly serviced by the South Bay Branch marshal's office. South Bay will retain the bay cities area of Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, Manhattan Beach and Palos Verdes Estates.

Duties of the deputies marshal include bailiffing all the the municipal courts within the county, as well as serving legal process incidental to lawsuits and the attaching of property, such as

Del Amo from just east of Crenshaw to Maple St.

Chace pointed out that \$14,500,000 has been allocated to cities in Los Angeles County. Chace also pointed out that work has begun on the improvements of the east side of Crenshaw Blvd. Northerly of Lomita Blvd. Project calls for extending the pavement in order to create an additional lane and provide for traffic channelization at the intersection.

SELF-SUPPORTING
During the last fiscal year the Los Angeles County Marshal's Department served 554,663 separate process and earned \$950,185.70 in fees (amount of fee is set by the

State Legislature). During the past eight years the growth of the marshal's department has been phenomenal. The service of process has increased 140%, earned fees increased 79%, and the office returned to the county almost 40% of the money expended for its maintenance.
