White, historian; Dr. Logan Fox, president of Ibaraki Christian College in Japan; Dr. Warren S. Jones, college speech department head; Vance Carruth, minister; William Slater Banowsky,

Mr. Cope served with the army during World War II and the Korean conflict. Minister of the Long Beach Church of Christ, Mr. Cope is also a lecturer on World Wide Ideologies.

Dr. Warren S. Jones, regular minister of the Redondo Beach Church of Christ, will speak Sunday morning on the "20th Century Church in Worship." Dr. Jones, who began work with the Redondo Beach congregation in September last year, is head of the speech department at Geore Pepperdine College. After attending David Lipscomb College, he received his doctorate from Wayne State University in Michigan. Dr. Jones has served as minister in Tennessee, Indiana, Michigan, as well as Bakersfield, California, and the southwest Los Angeles congregation.

Concluding lecture Sunday evening, Jan. 15, will be presented by Mr. John W. Young. "Looking Ahead" will be Mr. Young's topic. Mr. Young, who studied at Harvard University and holds a masters degree from Carnegie Tech, is minister of the Hawthorne Church of Christ.
