Elementary school lunches, including milk, cost 30 cents. Ice cream bars are six cents extra, while single bottles of milk cost four cents. On the menus are:

Monday — Chopped beef on whipped potatoes, tossed green salad, apple crisp with cheese stick, bread, butter, milk.

Tuesday — Frank 'n tater pie, green beans, carrot and celery sticks, citrus fruit cup, hot French bread, milk.

Wednesday — Turkey, mashed potatoes, gravy, cranberry fruit salad, pumpkin custard, bread, butter, milk.

Thursday — Spaghetti, meat sauce, carrots, peas, cole slaw, peach melba, cookie, bread, butter, milk.

**GOURMET CORN MUFFINS**  
1 packet (7 ounces) Albers Corn Muffin Mix  
1/2 cup milk  
1 egg

Prepare batter according to package directions. Then prepare variations as follows:

**Coconut - Curry Muffins:** Add 1/4 cup flaked coconut and 1 teaspoon curry to batter before baking.

**Orange - Peanut Muffins:** Add 1 tablespoon grated orange rind and 1/4 cup chopped peanuts to batter before baking.

**Date-Nut Muffins:** Add 2 tablespoons chopped dates and 2 tablespoons chopped nuts to batter before baking.

To bake: fill muffin cups 2/3 full. Bake in hot oven (400 deg. F.) 15 to 20 minutes or until golden brown.
