Award Bids for Improvements on Local Highway

Contract for the improvement of Crest Road in the Palos Verdes area has been awarded to the low bidder, A. J. Beinschroth, for the amount of \$96,225. Supervisor Burton W. Chace said this week.

The portion to be improved is from one-fourth mile easterly of Hawthorne Blvd. to Chrenshaw Blvd. It totals approximately one and one-third miles in length. Contracts calls for paving the center 40-foot section of the road and constructing a raised median intersection channelization strip at Chrenshaw Blvd., according to Chace.

The project will join on the west with the Hawthorne Blvd-Crest Road improvement just completed in this area is located at Indian Peak Road from Chrenshaw Blvd. to Hawthorne Blvd. "All of these improvements are designed to increase roadway access and provide better traffic circulation in and about the Southern Palos Verdes peninsula area," Chace said.


On duty to assist residents of the district will be Supervisor Hahn's deputy, Arlyn V. Weber.
