



To Draw Nurses**

Initiating a "New Nurse Program" for male and female applicants of the South Bay area, Air Force service personnel recently have been authorized to recruit qualified registered nurses for direct appointment and assignment to civilian schools for nurse anesthetist training.

Technical Sergeant Duane K. Hetler, local air force recruiting representative, announced the program is an 18 month course conducted in a civilian facility approved by the surgeon general, headquarters USAF.

During the training period, students receive full pay and allowances. Upon completion of the training, they will be assigned to an Air Force Hospital.

Study Committee**

Citizens of the Riviera section of Torrance have established the Parents for Continued Good Education to actively support the 50-cent override which is up for a vote again Feb. 14.

Sixteen fathers, who comprise the Parents Group, have devoted considerable time during the past months to compile facts which in turn are being presented in "buzz" sessions by the fathers to their neighbors.

In light of current financial problems, the 50 cent override is gaining the necessary support.

"We're convinced" says Charles Merlian, chairman, "that our problem in Torrance is simple, too many kids." "About one of four persons in Torrance is a school age child; the average city has one in eight of school age." First and only other over-ride ever voted since the Torrance district was unified was in 1956.

"Based on comparative facts," says Merlian, Riviera Parents' Group Chairman, "We're proud of our educational system and want to keep it at the top level with a 'yes' vote for the 50 cent support."
