

\$87,045 Initial Payment for State, National Christmas Seal Program

A check in the amount of \$87,045, representing initial payment in support of state and national Christmas Seal Programs, has been presented to representatives of the California Tuberculosis and Health Association and the National Tuberculosis Association by the Tuberculosis and Health Association of Los Angeles County.

Mrs. A. W. Warnock, 3200 Miraleste Drive, chairman of the TB association's Bay Cities area regional advisory committee, said that the

check issued today represented a percentage of local Christmas Seal contributions raised in the 1960 campaign. A portion of additional income received through March 31, the end of the organization's fiscal year, will also be allocated to the NTA and CTHA bringing a total contribution to Christmas Seal organizations outside the county to approximately \$151,050.

Included in program activities carried on by both the state and national voluntary tuberculosis associations, are medical and social research, program development, educational programs, rehabilitation cooperation and grant in aid allotments to high TB incidence areas in the United States.

"Our local board of directors feels that monies allocated to national and state programs serve county residents both directly and indirectly," Mrs. Warnock said. "A contagious disease like TB knows no geographic boundary line and over a period of years the portion of Christmas Seal funds used for TB control in Imperial County, for example, brings health dividends to the residents of our area."

Sheriff Declares Jail Emergency

The critical situation of the overcrowded County Jail reached alarming proportions today, as the morning count at the Hall of Justice facility soared to 3893.

Declaring state of emergency, Sheriff Peter J. Pitchess presented a list of proposals to the County Board of Supervisors this morning which, if approved, would bring a degree of temporary relief.

The Sheriff offered the following measures:

The installation of a metal roof over the top of the present Jail, adding necessary plumbing and other fixtures. Approximately 100 prisoners could be housed in this space.

The immediate construction of four additional, 100 man dormitories at Biscailuz Center in East Los Angeles.

Installing of plumbing facilities in an area now used for a Sewing Room in the Women's Section of the Jail. This would provide space for an additional fifty women.

Have the County enter into negotiations with incorporated cities with jail facilities, allowing them to hold felony prisoners in their own jurisdictions during preliminary examinations and trial.

The emergent nature is pointedly illustrated by the statistics presented today by the Sheriff. The County Jail, built in 1925, was designed to house 1800 inmates. The all-time high count this morning is 1000 more inmates than a year ago this date. Counting the outlying facilities such as Wayside Honor Rancho and Mira Loma, there are nearly 8000 inmates in the Sheriff's custody. There is no relief in sight until late 1963, when two new large institutions may be completed. The final note—the annual peak population in the Jail normally is reached in late March or April.

In declaring the emergency, the Sheriff stated, "Immediate relief is the only answer. An epidemic, fire, earthquake, or riot in this facility which was condemned three years ago, would be a major disaster."

Going Up?

You slide the thermometer under your tongue, hold it there for three minutes, take it out and check to see how far up the mercury has gone. 99.4 deg! Horrors, fever? Not necessarily. There isn't any one temperature for everybody all the time. Normal temperature may differ from one person to another, and for the same person at different times of the day. There's a normal range from about 97.2 deg. to 99.5 deg. Temperature is lowest early in the morning, highest in the late afternoon.

You can't tell your temperature by the way you feel. You can have a fever and feel chilled for a while, rather than hot.

With the exception of fever following brain injury, heart attack, sunstroke, there's no need to take anything to bring down a fever. The ordinary kind of fever which follows infections can't hurt you, and it often helps a doctor follow the course of an illness. Fever has a purpose. It prods the body into producing more white blood cells and antibodies to fight germs. There's also some reason to believe that fever increases production of the hormone ACTH, which helps the body combat the stress of infection.

A fever should be fed and watered, not starved. Fever hikes metabolism, increases the need for food and fluids, so easily digested foods are in order.

No need to pile on the blankets and heat up the room. The body's trying to get rid of the extra heat. Why make it tougher? Fever calls for a cool room and light covering.

Brethren Set Mrs. Clinger as Guest Speaker

Mrs. Clinger gained national prominence when she testified before the Un-American Activities Committee about her activities as a agent for the FBI in the Communist organizations in which she worked.

Traffic Fatality Rate Hits High

California's 1960 traffic fatality toll rose to within 81 of the all-time mark, final figures revealed by the California Highway Patrol showed this week.

Patrol Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden said the official tally was 3723. The highest year on record was 1956, when 3804 died in motor vehicle accidents.

"The figure is dismal even when it is known that the rate of fatalities per 100 million miles of vehicular travel held steady at 5.3, the same as 1959," the commissioner said.

"The 3723 figure means that slightly over 10 persons per day met violent death on our state's highways and streets. Many of these deaths were the result of mistakes or carelessness, momentary lapses which were the signal for tragedy to step in. Others resulted from willful violations of the traffic laws in which the guilty driver deliberately ignored the potential consequences of this action."

"No matter what your job or profession, remember that when you are behind the wheel, driving is your occupation. It requires total attention. There can be no distractions. Driving is too serious to be considered a game or avocation. It is a business. Make it a good business by applying the techniques of safe driving," he concluded.


