



Critical Need for Air Force Nurses

The Air Force has instituted a program whereby graduate, registered nurses may qualify for a direct commission and receive an 18 month anesthesia course while drawing the full pay and allowances of their commissioned grade.

Announcement of the new program was made by Technical Sergeant Duane K. Hetler, local Air Force recruiting representative, who states that both male and female nurses are eligible to apply.

Basically, the program provides for training at civilian schools offering an 18 month course in anesthesia which has been approved by the Air Force Surgeon General. Qualified applicants will receive a commission in the grade of first or second lieutenant, depending upon age, education and professional experience, and will be placed on active duty at the school. The students pay their own tuition and related expenses; however, they will receive full pay and allowances for their commissioned grade during the entire period of training. They will continue their active duty at Air Force Hospitals following completion of the course.

Sergeant Hetler explained that Air Force nurses enjoy the same pay and privileges as other officers of equal grade and that the anesthetist training program offers nurses an excellent opportunity for financial security while undergoing training.

NAA Conference Announced by Pyle

Resource persons from the community and surrounding areas are invited to Torrance High School to speak to the students in many areas. The practice of inviting outside speakers to address the students is an attempt to bring first hand information to the students to supplement the teaching in the classroom.
