Unitarians Slate Guest Speaker

Robert F. Williams, who says it is "far more dangerous for an American of African descent to travel through the U.S. Southland than for him to travel through Cuba," will be the principal speaker at a meeting here Sunday March 5. Williams, nationally prominent leader of the NAACP in North Carolina will give an eyewitness report on the events in Cuba, with emphasis on the fight against the "counter-revolution."

Meeting will be held at 8 p.m. at the Pacific Unitarian Church, 1610 Acacia in Torrance. Williams appearance locally is being sponsored jointly by the Social Action Committee of the Pacific Unitarian Church and the Greater Los Angeles Chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee. There will be no admission charge.

Williams, president of the NAACP branch in Munroe N.C., was given world-wide headlines two years ago when he led the country wide movement which freed two Negro children who were jailed in the famous "kissing case," for having allegedly been kissed by a little white girl in a children's game. He is a former Marine and edits the weekly newspaper, "The Crusader." He has made tours of Cuba and has written and spoken extensively about his experiences.
