He began his ministry in Lebanon, Pennsylvania, where he helped to found the Family Welfare Council of Lebanon county.

Since 1955, Rabbi Kaelter has been the spiritual leader of Temple Israel in Long Beach. He serves on the board of the Association for the United Nations; the Long Beach Symphony Society; and has headed the Festival of Jewish Arts for the past two years. 
