

Elks National Scholarship Program Open To High School Seniors in Torrance

Gas Companies Take Part In Commission Hearings

Southern California and Southern Counties Gas Companies, as part of their continuing policy of protecting the overall public interest of their customers, will take part in Federal Power Commission hearings beginning today in Midland, Texas.

The hearings are the first of the FPC's area gas pricing proceedings on producer rates and involve over \$10 million annually to Southland gas users alone.

A five-man team from the two local gas distributing companies and the Pacific Lighting Gas Supply Company will represent the companies and the eight million people in their service territory.

LOWER PRICES

The city of Los Angeles and the California Public Utilities commission will also be active in the hearings to assure the public the lowest gas prices compatible with continued long-term supplies.

Investment of \$250,000 in building funds in treasury bonds for a 90-day period was approved by the Torrance Board of Education Tuesday night. The money temporarily is available, since it is not needed until new construction begins. It will draw interest for the district through the investment.




POP TO OPEN
