### NATURALNESS

Michael Bernard, the 11-year-old who plays Sonny Flood, had only one small role in a classroom play before this show, but his complete naturalness and poise on stage belie this fact in an astonishing way. He plays an introverted boy, whose chief joys are going to the movies and learning long poems by heart, but Michael is just the

opposite. At the Valley Vista School he is on the All-Star basketball and All-Star football teams, and is going out for baseball next. Outside of school he likes to spend most of his time on water skis.

Sue Wood, Sonny's sister Reenie in "Dark," is a senior at Bishop Montgomery High School and has had quite a bit of experience on stage, though mostly as a singer. She is a member of the South Bay Civic Light Opera, and is presently studying singing and piano under the former director of that group, Melville H. Tully. She has appeared in "The Pirates of Penzance" and "The King and I," produced by the Dramatic Guild of Los Angeles, and in three school operettas, "Shreds and Patches," "Lady of the Terrace," and "Marie-Anne."

### EXPERIENCED

Vicki Volante, who plays the uninhibited "Flirt," is experienced in many theatrical media. She is also a very busy El Camino student and part time dental assistant. She began her acting in Pasadena, where she played at the Pasadena Playhouse and the Masque Theatre. Later she worked at the Gallery Theatre in Los Angeles.
