#### Scouts Choose Anne Griffin

South Bay Council of Girl Scouts is honored to announce that Anne Griffin, Palos Verdes Estates, Senior Scout of Troop 3, has been chosen by the Big Tree Region (Western states) to join with three other selectees to represent the region this summer on an eight-weeks nationally-sponsored Heritage Trail which will cover the south eastern one fourth of the United States.

Purpose of the Heritage Trail opportunity is to enable 24 International Rangers and 48 Senior Girl Scouts (4 from each region) to explore the LSA in 4 groups (each composed of 6 Rangers, 12 Senior Girl Scouts and 2 leaders) and to bring a national-international project into many parts of the country. Each of the four groups will tour a different section of the United States: North East, South East, North West, South West.

Each group will travel over a cross-section of the country and will have more or less parallel experiences seeing: historical places, natural phenomena, ethnic, religious, and cultural aspects of the USA: large industry, small industry or native crafts; agriculture; a stat university; a state capitol; a big city; a medium-sized city; a small town.

All four groups will come together at the University of Kansas at the end of the tour for two weeks to share experiences and to develop a guide which will be useful in the orientation of future Girl Guide/Girl Scout visitors to the United States.


