## YMCA Parents Start Drive Next Monday

On Monday, May 1, hundreds of Torrance YMCA parents will march in a May Day Parade for youth.

Five Thousand dollars is still needed in order to operate the "Y" programs during 1961, officials said. Parents of 6,000 local boys and girls will visit homes in Torrance with the hope of securing needed funds to conduct 118 youth clubs, sixteen sessions of YMCA camp, and all other services provided by the local youth agency.

**PARENTS CALL**  
Parents will be calling at 10,000 homes from 6 p.m. on Monday evening, and then will hear reports of progress at a coffee and do-nut session at YMCA headquarters, 2080 Washington Avenue.

Torrance YMCA receives no tax funds, and is not a Chest recipient, and thus, the agency must raise all operating funds from local families and firms. All funds received are expanded in direct youth work in Torrance, Lomita, Waveria and Riviera.

While the parents hope to visit every home, those who are away that evening, or who are missed are asked to mail contributions to the YMCA office, P.O. Box 33, Torrance, or to call for a visit from a volunteer.


