BM High School Sets Placement Test May 6

Placement tests for eighth grade boys and girls desiring to enroll as Freshmen at Bishop Montgomery High School will be administered at the school on Saturday, May 6, between 9 a.m. and 12 noon. These tests must be taken by every student who seeks to register for the ninth grade. They will not be admitted at a later date. Applicants must be present at the school at 8:30 a.m. Every boy and girl taking the test must present their eighth grade report card on May 6. It will be returned to them that same day. Bishop Montgomery High School accepts students from communities of Torrance, Palos Verdes, Rolling Hills, Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, Lawndale and Lomita. This new four year high school offers a three-track curriculum; namely, a choice of a college preparatory course, a business or commercial course, or a general academic course. In athletics, the school offers to the boys the 4 major sports and swimming, and for the girls all their seasonal sports. The 41 members of the faculty comprise 16 priests, 15 nuns and 10 lay teachers (5 men and 5 women). The school's first Senior Class will graduate on Tuesday, June 13 with His Eminence James Francis Cardinal McIntyre presiding. The ceremony will take place at 8 p.m. at St. James Church, Redondo Beach.
